NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1: CORPORATE INFORMATION:

Kolkata Glass & Ceramics Private Limited is a company registered under Company Act, 1956 and deals in all kinds and forms of glass and ceramics products.

NOTE 2: SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

(I) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared to comply in all material respects with the notified Accounting Standards by the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules 2006 (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis under the historical cost convention.

The accounting policies applied by the Company are consistent with those used in the previous period.

(II) Presentation and disclosure of financial statement:

The Company has prepared financial statements as per revised schedule VI notified under the Companies Act 2013. The company has also reclassified the previous year figures in accordance with the requirements applicable in the current year.

(III) <u>Use of Estimates:</u>

The preparation and presentation of financial statements in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Examples of such estimates are useful life of fixed assets, income taxes and other provisions. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Difference between the actual result and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialized.

(IV) Revenue Recognition:

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

- (a) Revenue from sale of goods and services rendered is recognized when significant risks and rewards of ownership of products and services have passed to the customers.
- (b) Interest on deployment of surplus funds is recognized using the time- proportion method based on the rates implicit in the transaction.
- (c) Dividend is recognized on cash basis.
- (d) Insurance and other claims, to the extent considered recoverable, are accounted for in the year of claim. However, claims and refunds whose recovery cannot be ascertained with reasonable certainty are accounted for on acceptance basis.

(V) <u>Provisions:</u>

A provision is recognized when an enterprise has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made.

Provisions made in terms of Accounting Standard 29 are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on the best estimates required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

(VI) <u>Taxation:</u>

Tax expense comprises of current, deferred and fringe benefit tax. Current income tax and fringe benefit tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to the tax authorities in accordance with the Indian Income Tax Act, 1961. Deferred income taxes reflects the impact of current year timing differences between taxable income and accounting income for the year and reversal of timing differences of earlier years. Deferred tax is measured based on the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that there is 'reasonable certainty that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

MAT credit is recognized as an asset only when and to the extent there is convincing evidence that the company will pay normal income tax during the specified period. In the year in which the Minimum Alternative Tax (MAT) credit becomes eligible to be recognized as an asset in accordance with the recommendations contained in guidance note issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the said asset is created by way of a credit to the profit and loss account and shown as MAT Credit Entitlement. The Company reviews the same at each balance sheet date and writes down the carrying amount of MAT Credit Entitlement to the extent there is no longer convincing evidence to the effect that Company will pay normal income tax during the specified period.

(VII) Contingencies:

Liabilities which are material and whose future outcome cannot be ascertained with reasonable certainty, are treated as contingent and disclosed by way of Notes to the Accounts.

(VIII) Earning per share:

Earning per share is calculated by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders, by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and weighted average number of shares outstanding during the year is adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

(IX) Cash & Cash Equivalents:

Cash & cash equivalents in the balance sheet comprise cash at bank and in hand (including cheques/drafts in hand), balance lying in banks in current account (including overdraft).
